Fall River City Pier Development Plans Moving Forward

Funding for Phase 1 of the overall infrastructure necessary to accommodate the proposed development of the City Pier for a 125 slip private marina, marine service center and ancillary restaurant use has been secured. Phase 1 includes construction of sheet piling, tie-backs, pile capping, and annulus in and around the northern seawall perimeter of the City Pier.

The estimated cost for Phase 1 of the development

is \$4,028,000. Multiple funding sources are being utilized to bring Phase 1 of the project to fruition. The Massachusetts Seaport Council is providing \$1 million, Massworks is providing a \$1.6 million grant, and the City is receiving a \$650,000 MassDevelopment Brownfields grant. The Fall River Redevelopment Authority will also be contributing \$778,000 in the form of a cash match.

A project timeline has already been established for phase one with the bid advertising happening in January 2017. Subsequently the bid opening will take place in February 2017 with the contract awarded and construction mobilization happening in March 2017. In April 2017 coated steel sheet piling, steel wale and tie rods will be purchased. Project demolition and debris removal will take place in May 2017 with installation of SSP, tie rods, concrete cap, annulus fill, CSO extension, check valve and fabric filter happening June—September 2017 including backfilling and grading. The contract expiration date for the project is October 2017.

Fall River Office of Economic Development's Executive Vice President Kenneth Fiola, Jr. is pleased to see Phase 1 of the City Pier project moving forward noting, "after years of trying to secure funding I am pleased that the Phase 1 component will be soon underway. This phase will help stabilize the pier itself and provide the foundation for the next phases of work. I would like to thank Governor Baker, Lt. Governor Polito, Representative Fiola and our state delegation for working with us to secure the necessary funding to move this project forward."

Fall River's Finest: John J. Doran

John J. Doran was born in Charlestown, MA in 1864, but his family moved to Fall River, MA when he was very young. His father worked in Naval shipyards, which spurred Doran's calling to the sea.

In 1884 Doran enlisted as a sailor and was steadily promoted during his career. In 1898, during the Spanish-American War, three warships were sent to dispatch sailors to destroy an underwater cable back to Spain. Doran was the coxswain on the SS Marblehead and was one of six men wounded by heavy gunfire from Spaniards who were protecting the cable. His hip was shattered, but he hid his injury and continued to work at successfully cutting both cables. As a result Doran was given the rank of master-at-arms, the highest rank an enlisted man could achieve at that time. For his bravery, Doran was bestowed the Medal of Honor. In addition, President Franklin D. Roosevelt and the


Department of the Navy named a destroyer, the USS Doran in his honor and memory.

Doran died in 1904 and is buried beside his father in St. Patrick's Cemetery in Fall River.

Twenty years after his passing, the Fall River community honored Doran's service to his country by naming a school in his memory and honor. The John J. Doran School has served students of Fall River for nearly ninety years.
